EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO DISTRICT JAIL, GURUGRAM, HARYANA



With a view to apprise and sensitize the students about the factual position of convicts in Prisons and Prison Reforms, a visit was organized by Amity Law School in consultation with Director General Police and Director General Prisons, to the District Jail, Gurugram on 6th September 2018. A total of 50 students of 5th, 7th, and 9th Semesters accompanied by Mr. Pranshul Pathak, Coordinator ALS and Mr. Amit Kumar, Assistant Professor visited the Jail, which is situated in Bhondsi. The jail is established in an area of 50 acres with a capacity of 2500 inmates and presently it houses 2382 inmates comprising of both male and female inmates. On arrival, Mr. Jai Kishan Chillar, Superintendent of Prison, welcomed the students and the faculty. The Jail has separate wards for male and female inmates and their recreational areas are also established separately.

Firstly, the students were shown the visiting area where the inmates could meet their relatives for a maximum duration of 15 minutes and could communicate via an intercom phone. After that, the students were introduced to a cashless procedure through which the inmate's relatives could transfer money to their accounts up to a maximum limit of Rs. 6000 per month.

Thereafter, the Superintendent of Prison addressed the students and informed them about the activities and other developmental programmes being run in the Jail. He apprised the students that the activities, skills and education prepare the inmates for a better life outside the prison and will bring a positive change in them. The students were also informed that India Vision Foundation



(IVF), an NGO formed by Ms. Kiran Bedi, conducts recreational activities for the reformation of the inmates, with a view to provide them with vocational skills, to help them in integrating back into the society once they are released. This also helps them to earn a living for themselves. The organisation conducts various recreational activities and provides them the opportunity to:

- Read, write, learn and complete their education
- Make painting and sculptures
- Take musical instrument classes sponsored by Sony Pictures
- Take a diploma in hairdressing, makeup, and other salon management courses sponsored by VLCC
- Complete web designing course (including MS Office and Tally)



After completing these courses, they are provided with a certificate of appreciation which can help them with their employment in future.

There is a well-established Khadi Factory in the male ward where they make Khadi thread to be sold to make clothes from. Alongside there is also a sewing and stitching workshop where the inmates make kurtas and handbags. This talent was appreciated in a fashion show organised in Mumbai which was attended by known



dignitaries like Zeenat Aman and Pooja Bedi and enhanced by 13 models. The women's ward has a special factory established for manufacturing sanitary pads with the help of Rotary Club, Lioness Club and Sampurna Club. The factory has the latest machineries and the extra pads are later distributed free of cost in various prisons of Haryana.



The inmates also performed two beautiful songs for the students expressing their guilt and the kind of reformation that is provided to them by the prison authorities in collaboration with IVF.

The students were briefed about the Phoenix Software, developed by one of the inmates, that is being used by the prison authorities to keep a record of the inmates by the Superintendent of Prison Office. The software contains even the minute details of the inmates regarding their meeting session, phone call session and also the things purchased by them from the prison canteen. The SP informed the students that the software is very secure and has received recognition from Haryana Police and Ministry of Home Affairs.



OUTCOME

This jail visit was a very good experience for the students as it is very important for them, as budding lawyers, to understand the system properly and to know the mentality of the people who commit offences. As a result of this, it is evident that the reformatory theory is being properly used by the Haryana Police in order to bring a change in the psychology of the inmates and make them a better person to survive in the society.
